### **ABOUT THE PROGRAM**

Founded in 1989, **21st Century Leaders (21CL)** is a non-profit organization that connects, transforms, and inspires high school students in Georgia to leverage diversity, explore career opportunities, and become leaders in their school, community and ultimately the workforce. 21CL's *Healthcare & IT Institute (HII)*, celebrating its 6th summer, is a week-long, residential leadership development program that focuses on healthcare and technology. This year's institute was held at Emory University from June 22-27, 2025

Students at HII explored the different facets of the growing healthcare and healthcare IT business world through interactive workshops with passionate professionals, networking opportunities and corporate insights. 

In addition to workshops and site visits, students had the chance to work in small groups to tackle the HII Challenge, sponsored by Mercer for the second year. Students were presented the challenge on Monday and presented to a panel of judges on Friday. Students were given two options to solve for: one focused on how the future of AI in the healthcare field can progress Mental Health support in the workplace and another focused on the healthcare landscape of 2025 and beyond as it relates to the challenges and opportunities in addressing health disparities.
